Frank Sieren is one of Germany's leading China experts. He is columnist for the Handelsblatt, and has written more books on China than any other German journalist. Frank Sieren has lived in China for almost a quarter of a century.

Frank Sieren (*1967) studied political science with a focus on economics at the University of Trier and at the Otto Suhr Institute of the Free University of Berlin. In the course of his journalistic career, he has worked for the Süddeutsche Zeitung, Die Zeit, Der Spiegel, and Deutsche Welle, among others. Frank Sieren has lived and worked in Beijing since 1994 and established a reputation for his reporting on the People's Republic of China and the political and economic developments there. No Western business journalist has lived in China longer than he has.

Frank Sieren is the author of numerous TV documentaries for ARD and ZDF, including the first documentary ever on China's involvement in Africa. He is co-founder and moderator of the Bosch Stiftung's Media Forum China, the highest-profile annual event for German and Chinese journalists since 2010. Since 2017, the forum has expanded to a trilateral meeting including the US.

His books on China regularly become bestsellers, are highly praised by critics and are the start of a broad Asia debate in Germany.
